




We know the earth is the Lord's




We know he made it, and it is good.




We know creation is in trouble because of the actions of humans

Travel


Food

It's designed to help households work out what their next steps are in caring for God's creation, whether they're completely new to this, or have been trying to live sustainably for years.


There are links to resources on the website, and you can sign up for monthly emails, focusing on a different area each month, giving hints and tips.

While you're working your way through the questions, you can get ideas for changes you can make to better care for God's creation, and create a personalised to do list of questions that you want to come back to.










## Celebrating success

The scheme is also designed to help us celebrate our successes, with Bronze, Silver and Gold Awards for households who reach at least bronze, silver or gold in all seven areas. And Commended and highly commended certificates for those doing well in at least five of the seven areas.



As members of the church, we're not alone. Hebrews tells us "Let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds" Churches can be part of this through encouraging member households to take part, and celebrating successes together, for example through giving out awards during services.
